
Virginia Brain Injury Fact Sheet

- In 2022, 5,454 people were admitted to the ER with a traumatic brain injury (VDH Injury Hospitalization Rate by Mechanism 2022).
- BIAV estimates that more than 300,000 Virginians are estimated to have brain injury complications as a result of a traumatic brain injury or stroke (Brain Injury Association of Virginia, 2023).
- TBI's account for about 30% of all injury-related deaths to Virginia residents each year, and roughly 16% of all injury-related inpatient, acute care hospitalizations (VDH Injury Hospitalization Rates 2022).
- Of more than 15,000 TBI's reported to the Virginia Statewide Trauma Registry in 2021, 13% were classified as severe, 4% as moderate and 82% as mild.

State-Funded Programs

There are none state-funded community-based programs serving persons with moderate to severe brain injury in Virginia; they are funded through a line-item appropriation in the state budget. In SFY 2023 :


